From Abdelaziz Onkoud I have received 11 problems in anonymous form. In my opinion, a level of the tourney is slightly above average: along with excellent logical compositions, there are some weak entries with duals and simple, uninteresting play.

I didn't mark the follow problems:

- Miroslav Sviták, No 5 (Kc4-Ke5). There are duals in twins b) and c). Also I do not quite understand: what are the similarities between the play in twins, except simple mates from Queen and Steed?

- Alexander Fica No 6 (Kh7-Kd5). Excellent 2-flight-giving-key with sacrifice of a Steed is the only thing which can be marked. Duals spoil everything – there are duals in the threat and in variations (even three (!) black Pawns on 2<sup>nd</sup> rank didn't help). The main thing is that I didn't see any idea of the problem, except the set of mates from Queen and Steeds. I think it needs to work on the problem...


- Dieter Müller, No 9 (Kb2-Kd4). Simple and largely symmetric play. Moreover, 2<sup>nd</sup> white move is repeated and white Steed is not participated in the solution;

- Dieter Müller, No 10 (Kh6-Kc4). Unfortunately, a threat of full-length is “virtual” (and, besides, it has a dual, although weak). Also one variation is too few for modern #5;

- Dieter Müller, No 11 (Kd7-Kb4). The key with capture of Pawn is bad in miniature. Moreover, the captured Pawn refuted a try. If it would be possible to exchange a try and a solution then it would be better...





A difficult design: for model mate f4# white must complete a diversion of Pg4 (from a capture “en passant”) via a sacrifice Sh3, but it must be done with a check! The 2-flight-giving key to the edge on board is spectacular. Also switchback maneuvers of white Steed and Bishop look good.







And again we see nice and intricate switchback maneuvers of white pieces (two Steeds in this time) with intersecting routes (in d4): Sd4-c2-d4 and Sc6-d4xf3-d4-c6. It's pleasant that a half of all white moves are quiet.

I didn't give a Prize to this problem in view of two things:

1) in my opinion, a play in the end is slightly rude and it reduces an impression due to the contrast with rest quiet play;

2) I have doubts about the necessity of the sacrifice 3.Rg6. Yes, this sacrifice is quite spectacular and not quite obvious. But this sacrifice seems to me an "alien element" because of its weak connection with the design. For my taste, #10 (position without bPf7 and wRg7) would look better...

### 2<sup>nd</sup> Honorable mention – No 3, Pavel Arestov

If now 1.b8Q? Bxb8 2.Sxb8 e5 3.Sc6 e6, then Black are in a pat. And White can complete only sacrifice of Steed: 4.Sa5! bxa5 5.b6 a4 6.b7 a3 7.b8Q a2 8.Qxe5 a1Q+ 9.Qxa1 e5 10.Kf2#, but, unfortunately, White were late for one move!

So, White must sacrifice a Pe4 to Black will not be in a pat after three moves.

Interesting and largely “study” sacrifice of the Pawn. Also the position itself looks as “fragment” of some study...It’s simple but very clear logic.
